Park Central Apartment Ministries exist to ENGAGE the community by building trust-relationships through the children, youth, and adult programs in the apartment community.

- Teachers:
Teach lessons from children's curriculum once a week, Tuesday, 4:30 - 6:00 PM, or Wednesday, 4:00 - 5:30 PM.
- Tutors :
High School Math, Science, English. Two hours a week.
- Teaching Assistants:
Help the teachers of the apartment ministry with crafts and classroom management.
- Community Activity Coordinators:
Plan and coordinate a calendar of activities that benefits the quality of life of the community at the apartment complex (i.e. Movie nights, grounds clean-up campaign, 4th of July Barbeque, community breakfast, etc.) 
- Youth Workers/Mentors:
Help to connect the teenagers of the apartment ministry with The Heights Student Ministry.
- CDL Bus Drivers :
Help with providing bus transportation (pick-up, drop-off) to people from the community on a rotating schedule.
- Food Pantry Coordinators:
Help with food packaging and distribution once a month at The Heights facilities.

Cornerstone works in partnership with Trinity Restoration Ministries and provides transitional housing for up to four men being paroled back to the Dallas area. All of those who are eligible for this residential ministry must have had contact with the ministry for six months prior to their release, and be actively involved the ministry's outreach Bible studies which are held in various prisons within the State of Texas.

- **Class Leader:**
Lead various classes (i.e. Bible Study, Substance Abuse, Financial, Parental, etc.)
- **Mentor:**
Be a mentor to encourage and pray with an ex-offender.
- **Job Training:**
Assist in helping men locate jobs for ex-offenders.

These relationships have been developed during their resettlement period and have continued over the years. Most of these families are of the Somali Bantu tribe. The mission of Refugee Resources, INC. is to continue the acculturation process through the befriending of refugee families with these programs in mind: (1) Cultural Education; (2) Education; (3) Empowerment.

- Friendship Partner:
Befriend an International Refugee family, teaching them through relationships about American customs that will help them as they transition to this new way of life.

Many group home members have families out of state or unable to visit, so forming ongoing relationships with caring Christian individuals helps to meet the needs for family, fellowship and love that so many cognitively challenged adults desire.

- Circle of Friends:
Volunteers host a fellowship of about 75 adults with cognitive disabilities on the first three Tuesdays of each month throughout the school year.
- Mosaic Volunteers:

Opportunities are available to work 20 – 25 times a year locally as part of the TBM’s Dallas area feeding unit. ENGAGE 1000 volunteers will be part of a team of workers preparing and serving 300 – 1,000 meals at an event. The unit is capable of preparing 8000 at a time, and is called upon for a variety of events in the Dallas area including Operation Care in downtown Dallas, where up to 9000 meals are prepared, local university and college events, mission fairs and

block parties for area churches, Evangelical crusades, and numerous events for Baptist organizations in the area. No prior experience is needed. Ladies are welcome. Participants will be trained.
