## TP Hoarders

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### OVERVIEW

Lined up and facing their opponents, students on each team will get the end of a shared length of toilet paper and attempt to tear it. When the toilet paper breaks, the players will take the portion of paper still in their hands and add the number of squares to their team's score. After every person has faced off, the team with the most collective squares wins!

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- All of your middle schoolers
- A volunteer
- Space in your environment large enough for students to form two parallel lines
- Many rolls of toilet paper (Things to consider: Determine the number of squares in a roll and divide that number by 10. That is the number of rounds that can be played with a single roll. Determine a rough estimate of how many students you expect to be in attendance. Divide that number by 2. This is the number of rounds that can be played.)

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### HOW-TO

#### PREP

- Clear a space in your environment for students to play without obstacles.
- Place the toilet paper rolls near the playing area.

#### PLAY

1. Divide your group into 2 teams and have them form separate parallel lines.
  2. Ask students to face the person in the line across from them. This will be their opponent.
  3. Have a volunteer create a length of toilet paper that is 10 squares long.
  4. Hand the first players in each line an end of the toilet paper.
  5. On your "Go," the opposing players will pull their toilet paper ends away from each other until the toilet paper splits.
  6. The number of full toilet paper squares each student has in their hand will be added to their team's score.
  7. Continue going down the line of students, adding the total number of squares each time to the teams' scores.
  8. After you've reached the end of the line, the team with the most toilet paper squares wins!
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
