Service Options

- Services may be held Monday—Thursday, between 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. We may be able to provide support for services at other locations on Friday and Saturday.
- Funerals are held when a body is present. Memorial Services are held when there is not a body present.
- Services will be held in the Chapel. The chapel will seat 350. There are no building usage fees for the Chapel for Heights members. Non-Heights members will be charged a \$400 fee for the Chapel.
- Services in the Worship Center (when requested and available) will be subject to all charges to cover costs (approximately \$1000).
- Members may request a specific Heights minister to officiate, or the Pastoral Care Minister will officiate. All ministers from outside of The Heights must ascribe to our Statement of Faith as outlined on our website at http://theheights.org/about/what-we-believe/.
- Funeral and Memorial Services are scheduled based on facility and staff availability. Services are not available on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays due to weddings, regular services, and staffing conflicts.

Planning the Service

The minister that is leading the service will need to meet with the family members to plan the service. This is a time for prayer and to organize the service, to share stories and favorite memories of your loved one, their legacy and blessings, important dates, and important events. If your loved one has left instructions for the service, share these at this time.

In addition, there are several required items that we will need as soon as possible to prepare the service and the program.

- The funeral home you are using
- A good picture (preferably digital)
- Hymns or music selections to be shared at the service
- Favorite Scriptures
- Names of Pall Bearers if appropriate
- A list of relatives (survivors)
- A Guest Registry
- The name and contact information for any Memorial Donations.

Music and Media

When a loved one dies, people often find themselves at a loss for words. Music can minister to us with meaning and feeling that words alone cannot. It is natural that the church involves music during the service designed to remember and celebrate the life of your loved one.

All music selections should give glory to God and witness to our hope in Jesus Christ. Hymns can be used as congregational singing or as solos. The Heights can assist you in finding soloists. A grand piano is utilized in the Chapel. The Worship Center utilizes an electric keyboard.

Video or multi-media presentation must be received, pre-viewed, and approved by the pastor or Care Office twenty-four hours before the service. The most reliable way to provide video content is a playable movie provided on a flash drive or email to our Media Department via Dropbox (rmclaughlin@theheights.org). We recommend that videos that run during the service should not run longer than 5-7 minutes. Longer videos can be run on a loop and can be set up to begin about 15 minutes before the service begins, as guests arrive.

Typical Order of Service
